What We Will Do:

- 1. Recognize that we are part of the problem, and that fixing the problem will require a consistent, sustained effort.
- 2. Educate ourselves on issues of systemic racism, implicit biases, and injustice in order to take positive action;
- 3. Listen with openness and acceptance to voices of color and other underrepresented members of our community;
- 4. Reduce or eliminate barriers to inclusion in our sport, including financial, structural, and cultural;
- 5. Speak out against acts that hurt or marginalize underrepresented groups in our community and sport;
- 6. Use language that respects and includes people of color and other marginalized groups;
- 7. Partner with or support groups that promote inclusion and equity of marginalized communities.

We must listen, learn, act, and reflect. We are not insulated from the larger systemic injustices that plague our country. We must understand how these injustices impact small, rural communities and how they affect our own learning and implicit biases.

Our society has a long history of injustice that will not be erased overnight. However, with empathy and self-reflection leading to sustained and informed action, we can grow wider participation in Nordic skiing and ensure all our participants feel welcome and accepted.
